

Day 10 Wednesday, 25th July

It appears the only constant at Bisley this year has been the weather with its 30° deg plus days! Scores have been up and down across the board with all shooters having a bad range at some point. The constant dry weather and high temperatures are definitely making for challenging conditions.

Today is a tough one with four ranges, the Lovell 1000yds x 10 shots, Queens Stage 1 - 300yds, 500yds and 600yds each x 7 shots. Both Century short ranges and Stickledown long ranges operate at the same time. Depending on the matches, Century can utilise 100+ targets and Stickledown 50 targets. Which is a lot of people moving to and from the ranges throughout the day.

Another constant for Bisley is the Chief Range Officer's message to competitors at the commencement of each and every range. Without fail shooters will hear the following message over loudspeaker:

"Message 1 is about to be sent to the butts. When your target appears you may load and carry on. Good shooting to you all."

Yesterday, James Corbett, shot 75.14 in St Georges I, along with Kelvin Ramsey from Britain. They now face a tie shoot scheduled for 1pm Thursday to determine the winner of the match.
